

RESOLUTION NO. 2026- 01

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY,  
ARKANSAS, AUTHORIZING  
DISPOSITION OF 2017 FORD EXPLORER;  
APPROVING REMOVAL OF 2017 FORD EXPLORER  
FROM LIST OF ASSETS;  
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of Fairfield Bay has received a request from the Police Department to approve the disposition of a 2017 Ford Explorer because it is at the end of its useful life, is in need of certain mechanical repairs (which exceed the value that might be realized on sale), and is no longer useful for the Police Department; and to remove it from the City's and the Police Department's lists of assets; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has carefully considered the request, and, having discussed it at a Regular Session of the City Council, approves the request;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS, that:**

1. The 2017 Ford Explorer [VIN 1FM5K8AR0HGB65542], asset no. 178, acquired on or about February 9, 2017, for a purchase price of \$25,985.00 has reached the end of its useful life, is in need of repairs, and is no longer being used by the Police Department, because the cost of the repairs exceeds the fair market value of the vehicle.
2. The fair market value of the 2017 Ford Explorer, given the mileage and age, after Police Department use, is less than the cost of necessary repairs, and is less than a nominal value of \$100.00 because the vehicle is not operational.
3. The City Council hereby approves the disposition of the 2017 Ford Explorer by the City in the most economical manner possible as authorized by state law, including by sending it to the dump, or authorizing a sale for use of the parts by an entity that may

disassemble it. The Police Department is also authorized to transfer the vehicle to the Fire Department for use in training exercises (e.g., as a disabled vehicle). The Recorder-Treasurer shall retain a statement or indication of the manner of disposition of this asset, and the value obtained, if any (such as "for scrap" or "for parts"). On a disposition for scrap or parts, the Department shall first remove identifying decals, or spray paint over decals identifying the vehicle as a City of Fairfield Bay Police Department vehicle.


4. The City shall remove this asset from its list of assets, and the Police Department shall remove this vehicle from its list of assets (No. 178). The Mayor, Recorder-Treasurer, and Chief of the Police Department, are further authorized to take any and all steps necessary to carry out this Resolution, including transferring title to the vehicle or notifying the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration that the vehicle has been permanently disabled, and that it is being disassembled for sale or disposal in a dump.
5. The City Council hereby ratifies, confirms, approves, and endorses any and all actions of the Police Department, the Mayor, and the Recorder-Treasurer, to date, to effectuate the transfer of this vehicle.
