

RESOLUTION NO. 2024- 35

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY
APPROVING TRANSFER OF FUNDS
FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT;
APPROPRIATING FUNDS
FOR A COMPENSATORY PAYOUT TO ANOTHER POLICE AGENCY
FOR AN OFFICER WHO FINISHED THE POLICE ACADEMY IN 2024;
APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF
COST OF BODY ARMOR;
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, The City of Fairfield Bay, and the Fairfield Bay Police Department, endeavor to protect the City of Fairfield Bay, its residents, citizens, voters, visitors, property owners, and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, The City and the Police Department have a budget for training purposes, but do not have an expense item set up to reimburse another Police Agency (local governmental unit) to compensate the cost of sending a police officer to the Police Academy upon acceptance of an offer of employment for the City of Fairfield Bay, although such reimbursement is required by state law on a *pro-rata* basis; and

WHEREAS, The City recognizes that it would be less expensive to reimburse the partial cost of sending an officer to the Police Academy, than it would be to send a new officer to the Academy for certification training; and

WHEREAS, The City recognizes that it is less expensive, and more timely, to reimburse the other police department for its cost of body armor for the officer, since the officer will be bringing that body armor with him, if he accepts an offer of employment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS:

1. The City Council finds and determines that there is a need to authorize the Police Department to reimburse another governmental unit for the *pro-rata* cost of a certified police officer attending the Police Academy, when a certified law enforcement officer accepts an offer of employment with the City of Fairfield Bay, after completing the Police Academy within the previous 18 months. The Council also finds and concludes that reimbursement for body armor (which the officer will bring to the City of Fairfield Bay) is appropriate in this instance.


2. The City Council hereby APPROPRIATES AND APPROVES expenditures, up to \$8,638.29, as reimbursement to another governmental unit, in the Police Department budget, for the year ending December 31, 2024, as required by Arkansas Code Annotated Section 12-9-209,

plus the cost of body armor that the officer will bring with him, accordingly. The Recorder-Treasurer is authorized to utilize unappropriated Police Department revenue for this purpose. The Recorder-Treasurer is authorized to transfer funds from the Police Department training budget, if funds are available, for this purpose. The Recorder-Treasurer is authorized to transfer unappropriated reserves from the Franchise Tax account, if funds are not available in the Police Department training budget.


3. The Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, and the Chief of the Police Department, be, and they are hereby, AUTHORIZED TO TAKE any and all appropriate actions necessary to put this Resolution into effect.

4. This authorization, and appropriation, is effective immediately, and the expenditures may take place as the Recorder-Treasurer shall decide, upon the acceptance of a new police officer of an offer of employment with the City of Fairfield Bay Police Department. The City will amend its Budget Ordinance, as part of its annual closing budget reconciliation process, at a later date, accordingly.

RESOLUTION NO. 2024- 34

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY,
ARKANSAS, AUTHORIZING THE MILLAGE RATE
OF PROPERTY TAX FOR THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY,
FOR THE YEAR 2024, TO BE COLLECTED IN
2025, IN BOTH VAN BUREN AND CLEBURNE COUNTIES,
ARKANSAS; TO CONTINUE THE MILLAGE RATE THAT
HAS BEEN IN EFFECT SINCE IT WAS FIRST IMPOSED;
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated Section 26-25-102 provides that a city may levy a tax on the real and personal property located within the city for the purpose of raising General Fund revenues in any one year, pursuant to the provisions of the Arkansas Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated Section 26-73-202 requires the city council of any municipality to make out and certify to the county clerks the rate of taxation levied by the city on the real and personal property within the city; and


WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interests of the City of Fairfield Bay to levy the rate of taxation on the real and personal property located within this city, as set forth below, and to certify the same to the County Clerks of Van Buren and Cleburne Counties, and to authorize the Quorum Courts of Van Buren and Cleburne Counties to levy said tax for the year ending December 31, 2024, to be collected in 2025, which is consistent with the manner in which the City has levied and collected taxes for more than a decade;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS, that:

1. The property tax rate for the City of Fairfield Bay General Fund Revenue on the real and personal property situated within the city, and to be collected in the year 2025, shall be fixed and levied at the rate of five (5.0) mills on each dollar of assessed value of real and personal property. This is the current rate of taxation, and has been for more than a decade.


2. The rate of taxation levied herein on the real and personal property within the city shall, by this Resolution, be certified, respectively, to the two County Clerks to be placed upon the tax books and collected in the same manner that the state and county taxes are collected.
3. The Quorum Court of Van Buren County, and the Quorum Court of Cleburne County, be, and they are hereby, authorized to levy this tax as set forth herein, for real and personal property located within the City of Fairfield Bay, for the year 2024, to be collected in 2025, at their regular meetings in November of 2024, according to law.

IT IS SO RESOLVED by the City Council for the City of Fairfield Bay, Arkansas, at its regular City Council Meeting, on this 14th day of October, 2024.

RENAMING THE BUILDING THE
DONI HOVICK EMERGENCY SERVICES COMPLEX,
CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS;
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, The City of Fairfield Bay, the Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, the City Council, and the departments currently operating out of the "Department of Public Safety" Building at 101 Little Rock Drive, Fairfield Bay, Arkansas, wish to dedicate that building to the Honor and Memory of Chief Doni Hovick, and rename it, accordingly; and

WHEREAS, Doni Hovick began volunteering for the Fairfield Bay Fire Department in 2017, became the Chief of the Fire Department on September 1, 2021, and passed away on August 6, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Chief Hovick honorably served the citizens of Fairfield Bay, and the surrounding communities, with loyalty, dedication, and courage for seven years; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, the City Council, the Fire Department, and all of the City's departments, employees, and volunteers, wish that Chief Hovick rest peacefully, knowing that he will not be forgotten;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS:


SECTION 1. That the City Council hereby DEDICATES TO THE HONOR AND MEMORY OF CHIEF DONI HOVICK, the City Building currently identified as the "Department of Public Safety" Building, located at 101 Little Rock Drive, Fairfield Bay, Arkansas.

SECTION 2. That the City Council hereby RENAMES the City Building located at 101 Little Rock Drive, Fairfield Bay, Arkansas, to be the "Doni Hovick Emergency Services Complex, City of Fairfield Bay, Arkansas."

SECTION 3. That the Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, and the Fire Department be, and they are hereby, AUTHORIZED AND APPROVED to take any and all additional actions as may be necessary to memorialize and record the City's dedication of the City building located at 101 Little Rock Drive, Fairfield Bay, Arkansas, to the honor and memory of Chief Doni Hovick, and to rename it as set forth hereinabove.

RESOLUTION NO. 2024- 31

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY
REGARDING APPROVAL OF
ROAD STRIPING AGREEMENT
FOR THE STREET DEPARTMENT;
APPROPRIATING FUNDS
FOR ROAD STRIPING;
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, The City of Fairfield Bay currently needs striping on several different streets and roads, as a result of maintenance which has improved the roads, streets, or helped to crack-seal the surfaces; and

WHEREAS, The City has received a proposal to stripe approximately 24 miles of roads, at the estimated cost of \$22,978.58; and

WHEREAS, The City did not budget the striping of streets and roads in 2024, but believes that it has sufficient unappropriated funds available in the Street Department accounts to meet this estimate; and

WHEREAS, The City has determined that the amount of funds at issue does not require competitive bidding, and that the matter is urgent based upon the time of year, and the need to complete the striping before the average temperature becomes too low for a successful project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS:

1. The City Council finds and determines that the attached proposal from "Time Striping, Inc.," DBE Certified, dated on or about August 5, 2024, in the amount of \$22,978.58, will meet the City's needs for striping roads in the most expeditious manner possible under the circumstances.
2. The Mayor, and the Street Department specifically, be, and they are hereby, AUTHORIZED AND APPROVED to stripe the 24 miles of roads identified on Exhibit A (attached hereto) pursuant to the DBE Certified August 5, 2024, estimate, Exhibit B (attached hereto) without the necessity of competitive bidding, within budgetary constraints, up to \$23,000.00, for execution in the 2024 calendar year.

3. The City Council hereby APPROPRIATES AND APPROVES expenditures of \$23,000.00 for striping 24 miles of roads pursuant to the DBE Certified August 5, 2024, estimate, from unappropriated reserve funds in the Street Department accounts. An amendment

to the 2024 Budget Ordinance will be made separately, in accordance with the City's usual practice of amending the Budget by Ordinance at the end of the calendar year.


4. The Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, and the Street Department, be, and they are hereby, **AUTHORIZED TO TAKE** any and all appropriate actions necessary to put this Resolution into effect, and have roads striped, in accordance with this Resolution, for the calendar year ending December 31, 2024.

5. This authorization, and appropriation, is effective immediately following its approval by the City Council, and the expenditures may take place as the Recorder-Treasurer shall decide.
